SUPPLEMENTARY APPROPRIATION 2019-20

OVERVIEW

In the Supplementary Appropriation Bill (No. 1 2019-20) recognises an additional 4.1 million dollars in Government revenue along with 4.1 million dollars in expenditures. The expenditure changes include housekeeping measures to ensure that Government spending is being correctly reflected in the accounts.

- **4.1 million dollars** is additional revenue in Management fees from NRPCC for RPC Operations. This revenue is to flow to Treasury before the end of the financial year.
- **2.1 million dollars** is allocated to the local employees employed by State Owned Enterprise (SOE's) as payment towards the 19% Ex-gratia payout.
- **573,287 thousand dollars** is payment allocated as Ex-gratia to our vulnerable citizens, our elderly and those living with disability.
- **194,553 thousand dollars** is appropriated to be the 19% Ex-gratia payout to local Nauruan Staffs working at our overseas diplomatic missions, as well as civil servants which includes Trainee teachers working at our Community Play Centers.
- **152,979 thousand dollars** has been provided under Presidency budget to AOG Church to build a new Church Hall located in Aiwo.
- **261,170 thousand dollars** is appropriated to NRC as subsidies for operational purposes related to Phosphate Bin demolition project.
- **400,000 thousand dollars** is allocated to Sports Department for the development and promotion of Power lifting in the wake of our success at the recent World Championships.
- **292,842 thousand dollar** has been allocated to Media Bureau for the purchase and upgrade of technical and communications equipment for the new Nauru Media Centre.
- **80,000 thousand dollars** has been allocated to Home Affairs for Tribe Day. This is supporting the Government initiatives to promote Nauruan Culture.

Overall this Supplementary Appropriation recognises the additional revenue and provides for expenditures that have arisen since the original budget. With the passing of this Bill the budget remains approximately in balance for the financial year.
