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SUPPLEMENTARY APPROPRIATION 2018-19

OVERVIEW

In the Supplementary Appropriation Bill (No. 6) 2018-19. an additional 2 81 million dollars in Government revenue is recognised and a further 2.8 million dollars in expenditures is appropriated for the financial year ending June 30th, 2019.

The additional revenue relates to the Australian dollar equivalent of USD\$1.94 million dollars of fisheries revenue flowing from PNA pooled days. This revenue is to flow to Treasury before the end of the financial year.

The Supplementary Appropriation provides a further \$1.5 million dollars as a subsidy to NPRT for debt repayment. This will be provided to NPRT before the end of the financial year. It also provides for a \$500 thousand-dollar loan to Ronphos. The terms and conditions of which will be determined by Cabinet.

A further \$500 thousand dollars has been provided under the Ministerial budget for Nauru Community Housing Scheme payments.

This appropriation also provides an additional \$300 thousand dollars to the Department of Infrastructure to undertake further roadworks.

Overall this Supplementary Appropriation recognises the additional revenue and provides for expenditures that have arisen since the original budget. With the passing of this Bill the budget remains approximately in balance for the financial year.

The Government has been informed that a further USD\$1.94 million dollars in fishing revenue will be received. The revenue relates to PNA pooled days that will be transferred from the PNA Secretariat. The current exchanges rate of approximately 69 US cents to the Australian dollar has been used.
