SUPPLEMENTARY APPROPRIATION No.3 2021-22

OVERVIEW

Supplementary Appropriation Bill (No.3) 2021-22 recognises additional Government revenue of \$34.7 million, and \$34.7 million in expenditure, with a small surplus balance of \$20 thousand.

This will bring total expected revenue for 2021-22 to \$328.1 million, and \$327.9 million is appropriated for expenditure, leaving a surplus balance for the year of \$0.3 million.

This Bill reflects updated revenue and expenditure estimates to take account of:

- the 6-month extension of the Regional Processing Centre agreement with Australia from 31 December 2021 to 30 June 2022
- outcome of the mid-year review of budget estimates
- government decisions taken since the last supplementary budget was brought down

- \$3.9 million is provided to the Fiscal Cash Buffer to cover for urgent and unforeseen commitments for the rest of the financial year.
- \$2.5 million is provided to cover hire fees for tug boats used in the phosphate and fuel ship operations.
- \$0.5 million is provided the centralised freight budget to cover for departments end of year bulk orders.

\$6.5 million is provided to the Department of Multicultural Affairs to cover for 3-month worth of expenditure measures following confirmation of RPC extension with Australia. MCA was only provided with a 9-month expenditure provision in the original budget to cover operations up to December 2021 and the expected tail out effect up to March 2022. With the recent announcement of the extension, a budget supplementation is required to cover for the remaining 3 months ensuring that the department if fully funded for the year.

capacity of the quarantine facility in Nauru and to properly manage the risks of a potential outbreak, one charter flight would not be ideal.
