### SUPPLEMENTARY APPROPRIATION NO.2 2023-24

#### **OVERVIEW**

The Supplementary Appropriation Bill (No.2) 2023-24 recognise a net increase in government revenue estimates by \$24.9 million, and \$24.8 million in expenditures, resulting in a surplus balance of \$0.2 million dollars.

The supplementary will brings the total expected revenue for 2023-24 to \$318 million with \$317.5 million appropriated for expenditure, leaving a year-end surplus balance of \$0.4 million.

This Bill reflects updated revenue and expenditure estimates to take account of:

- Adjustments in revenue due to additional foreign aid
- A mid-year revenue review that reflects better than expected taxation collections, alongside reductions to Fisheries estimates caused by lower demand for purse seine fishing days
- New spending decisions made since the supplementary budget was approved in December 2023

The tranche 2 loan funds from EXIM Bank, initially earmarked for the purchase of the second NAC passenger aircraft is unlikely to be received, due to the change in our political recognition to China.

\$20.4 million in additional tax revenue is recognised based on favourable collections in the year to date, driven by better-than-expected RPC activities.

There is a net revenue adjustment of \$23.3 million under Finance Other - General Budget Support. This adjustment includes an increase of \$30 million to account for new budget support funds and a decrease of \$6.8 million to reflect the non-receipt of grant from Taipei Province of China that remain undrawn at the time of our diplomatic transition. This reduction consists of \$5 million in budget support and 1.7 in repayment financing support for the Nauru Airlines and Ronphos Equipment loans.

An adjustment to Fisheries purse seine fishing days is necessary to account for unsold fishing days, reflecting lower demand than expected, which is partly attributed to El Nino effects.

\$11 million is allocated to Finance Other and comprises of:

- \$2.5 million for prepayment of next year's trust fund contributions, accounting for 10.1% of net revenue from this supplementary
- \$5.1 million in Grants directed to SoEs, including \$1.2 million to ESC in response to the increased RPC activity following arrival of new refugees, \$0.9 million to Eigigu Supermarket for working capital support and another \$0.8 million to Nauru Post to address past debts, urgent repairs, and vehicle replacement.
- \$0.3 million loan to Nauru Post to assist in establishing a new warehouse in Brisbane
- \$3.4 million to fund the continuation of Alternative Pathway program training, covering tuition fees, travel and accommodation for trainers, and student allowances
- \$1.9 million is reserved for the Fiscal Cash Buffer to cover urgent and unavoidable expenditure measures for the remainder of the financial year
